Julie Massengill Monroe County Sheriff's Office Jail Administrator



Jermaine conducted a qualitative study on the Role Perceptions of African American Police Officers.



History and research support the fact that African Americans and other minorities are recruited to address social unrest

and repair broken relationships that exist between police and urban communities. This study addresses the research gap, helping the law enforcement community understand how African American Officers view themselves and perceive the role they play in diversifying their departments, and repairing police-community relations.

In 2014 Jermaine retired from the Flint Police Department after 18 years of service. In 2014 he joined Grand Rapids Community College as an Assistant Professor of Criminal Justice and Corrections Coordinator. He currently serves as the Training Director for Grand Rapids Community College's Sheriff's Corrections and Police Academies.

MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID FOR FIRST RESPONDERS/CORRECTIONS TRAINING

Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) is a national, one-day, in-person training course designed to teach the basics of identifying, understanding, and responding to behavioral health crises. This 8-hour course will teach Corrections Officers the unique risk factors and warning signs of mental health problems, build understanding of the importance of early intervention, and, most importantly, teach Officers how to help arrestees in crisis or experiencing a mental health challenge. This program also provides response options to help Officers de-escalate incidents and better understand mental illnesses so they can respond to mental health related incidents appropriately without compromising safety. In addition to mental illness and de-escalation skills, substance use, anxiety, depression, and suicide will also be discussed. MHFA for Public Safety is recognized and supported by the Michigan Mental Health Diversion Council (MMHDC), Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) of Michigan, and CIT International. NIJO Legal-Based Jail Guideline A02.03.02 No Creation of Rights or Protect Interests

KEY ISSUES:

I was recently invited to attend a closed door meeting with numerous state sheriffs to discuss concerns about some recent in-custody deaths. One particular legislator had publicly declared intentions to create legislation to "fix" the problems of suicides in jails in the state.

Those representing the sheriffs argued additional proposed legislation would not guarantee the legislator the benefits sought, as they were isolated issues and not systemic problems as a whole.

While the idea to create such legislation may sound appealing to the general public, media and some legislators as a knee jerk reaction to a singular event, it's important to think about serious "unintended consequences" of such actions.
