## FIRST MICHIGAN JAIL COMMAND STAFF ACADEMY HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL!

The MSCTC in partnership with and presented by the National Institute for Jail Operations (NIJO), and co-sponsored by the Michigan Municipal Risk Management Association (MMRMA), completed the first Michigan Jail Command Staff Academy (JCSA) on May 20, 2021, in Lansing, MI.

Program tuition\* was sponsored by the MSCTC with the command curriculum designed by NIJO. Participants that successfully completed this Academy received an Academy Completion Certificate from the MSCTC and the MMRMA, along with approximately 72

credit hours that may be applied toward the NIJO National Certified Correctional Supervisor (NCCS) or National Certified Correctional Executive (NCCE) certifications.

Jail Command Staff Academy courses included leadership, budgeting and RFP, data driven statistics, correctional law updates, proactive liability defense, report writing, investigations, and legal issues.

NIJO Legal-Based Jail Guideline: D03.01.01

**Inmate Management Restrictions** 

**KEY ISSUES:** 

An inmate in general housing refuses to cuff up and ends up in an altercation with an officer. Use of force is deployed and the situation is appropriately handled. So, what about the aftermath? Yes, there will be an incident report involving use of force. Yes, there will be a disciplinary investigation and hearing. But prior to any disciplinary measures taken, there is likely a need for the jail to employ temporary restrictions. This may include removing the inmate from his cell and placing him in administrative segregation. How can the use of temporary restriction orders (TROs) be used as a fundamental management tool for the safety, security and order of the facility?
