 appreciated.
- 2. As a follow-up to the Council's interim policy changes regarding the pre-hire EMPCO Written Exam that took effect on August 1, 2021, we have asked each Sheriff's Office to provide MSCTC with their Minimum passing score for the Written Exam. Please make sure to submit your minimum passing score to us as soon as possible.

CHANGES TO ANNUAL IN-SERVICE TRAINING REQUIREMENTS EFFECTIVE THIS YEAR!

The following changes were implemented to the annual in-service training requirements for Local Corrections Officers beginning January 2021:

- 1) Two (2) hours per year of Mental Health training required as part of the yearly 20-hour in-service requirement.
- 2) No more than 5-hours of the 20-hour in-service training requirement can be comprised of Firearms training.

JAILCON21 ONLINE IS MOTIVATIONAL (AND FUN!)



NIJO Legal-Based Jail Guideline: G02.04.01

Preparation of Meals

KEY ISSUE:

"Three hots and a cot!" Let me ask, is that really the standard? Are jails required to serve meals hot? If so, how many? Let's add to this issue. Unlike persons in the free world,

inmates are dependent on jail staff to ensure that their nutritional needs are met. There are varying opinions about what might be considered "nutritious" and those opinions seem to regularly make their way into inmate-filed grievances, media and the courtroom. Administrators must balance the requirements to provide food services on a limited budget, accommodating a wide range of dietary and religious needs. It isn't easy but knowing what the law actually requires in the preparation of meals provides the necessary framework.
