IMPORTANT REMINDER TO SUBMIT YOUR IN-SERVICE TRAINING WAIVER REQUEST ASAP!

With 2021 now behind us, it is important to submit Waiver Requests for your Corrections Officers who have not completed their 2021 In-Service Training requirement. The requests should be submitted to our office no later than Monday February 28, 2022, in order to be considered at the April, 2022 Council meeting.

If you have a Corrections Officer on your LCOTS roster who has not completed their minimum 20-hours of In-Service Training, which includes at least 2 hours of Mental Health training, and a Waiver Request Form is not submitted, your county will not receive a 2021 100% Compliance Certificate.

Reminder: In order for your Corrections Officers to be in compliance with having at least 2 hours of mental health training each year, the training must be recorded under the "Mental

Health" category in the LCOTS system. If the training is not recorded under "Mental Health", it will **not** be recognized as meeting the requirement.

Sheriff Gary Schuette hired me on 11/21/2021 as the Jail Administrator for the Jackson County Office of the Sheriff.

Occupationally, I started my career with the Michigan Department of Corrections (MDOC) at the age of 19 as a Corrections Officer. Shortly thereafter, took a military leave of absence to join the United States Marine Corps (USMC). After serving in the Infantry



and being honorably discharged I returned to the MDOC and was steadily promoted to a variety of custody levels during my career, giving me the experience and knowledge of all facets of correctional facilities within the MDOC, ranging from Correctional Officer to Senior Executive Warden. MSCTC On-Line In-Service Training DACOTA Spotlight – January 2022

Through a training partnership with MSCTC, the National Institute for Jail Operations provides Michigan agencies with engaging legal-based online training through DACOTA—NIJO's Detention and Corrections Online Training Academy. All DACOTA curriculum is approved for all levels of NIJO Professional Certification (NCCO, NCCS, and NCCE).

Currently, the DACOTA Catalog contains 69 online courses providing 75 CEUs of corrections-specific training based on what the law requires for running safe and secure facilities. As of the end of January 2022, Michigan DACOTA online learners have completed 382 courses and 421 credit hours. As of the end of the January, 18 Michigan agencies have learners getting trained in the DACOTA platform. FIRE SAFETY INSTRUCTOR DEVELOPMENT COURSE- ONLY ONE IN 2022!

NIJO Legal-Based Jail Guideline: D08.02.01 – Suicide Screening

KEY ISSUES:

Not many jail administrators make promises to their sheriff saying "We are going to eliminate suicides from happening at this jail." Why not? While that is the best intention of every jail administrator and officer, the truth is that it is impossible to eliminate suicide. It doesn't happen in the free world and even the best run agencies may have a successful suicide during their watch.

Suicide screening is a proactive means for administrations to try and prevent inmate suicides by identifying risk factors which may indicate suicide ideation.
